## **Application Timeline**

Oct 1st

All college applications are now open

Nov 15th

Last day to submit application for review on the Application Check Google Form Nov 30th

UC and CSU applications due

Dec

FAFSA/CADAA Applications Open Date TBA Feb 15th

Last day to submit FAFSA/CADAA for extra graduation tickets

\*\*\* Community College applications occur later; our main focus right now are the 4-year colleges that have earlier deadlines



## **Early Decision versus Early Action**

## **Early Decision**

A student who is accepted as an ED applicant MUST attend the college (binding)

ED plans can be difficult because students/families do not have the opportunity to compare financial aid offers.



## **Early Action**

Students receive an early response to their application but do not have to commit to the college until the normal reply date of May 1st.

## **Test Optional**

Students may choose to submit SAT/ACT scores

If a student does not submit any scores, it will not count against them



### **Test Blind**

Schools will not take students' test scores into consideration during the admissions process

Even if students send scores, they will not be used in the admissions process

## Different Colleges Require Different Applications

**California State University System** 

The University of California System

CSU

No letters of recommendation or essays






The Common Application is used for some private or out-of-state schools.
Others may provide their own application

# You'll notice:

Not every school will ask for a letter of recommendation. Students need to be positive before asking their recommenders!

Students should send their recommenders a "brag sheet" to help highlight their accomplishments, interests and other items it would be helpful to know while writing a LOR.

## Common App Essay (and many other college essays)

- 1 prompt, 650 word maximum
- Writing style matters; 5-paragraph structure is recommended
- Literary tone
- Centers on anecdote with "hook"
- Supported by recommendation letters
- Focus on personal values and growth experiences
- Core of prompt: "Who are you"



## **UC Personal Insight Questions**

- 4 responses, 350-word maximum each
- Not scored on structure or style
- Factual tone
- Examples over storytelling
- Self-advocacy
- Focus on actions taken, impact
- Core of questions: "What have you done with available opportunities?"

Think of it as answering an interview question, rather than writing a fancy storytelling essay

Common mistakes: Writing too much of your PIQ about someone else, avoiding "I statements", using too much "fluffy writing".



## Things to Double Check in the Application

#### Dates to Check

Applying for Fall 2024 (undergraduate) Graduation Date: June 6, 2024

#### **Term Type**

We are a **SEMESTER** school!

#### **Grading Scale**

A-F Grading System On a 4.0 scale

#### Double Check Untaxed Income

This number is usually \$0 for most families

#### **College Classes**

All college classes are at a "Freshman" level on the CSU app



#### Tips for Guiding Students Through the College Application Process:

- Arrange Campus Visits
- Discuss a plan Do they want to stay local, live at home etc
- Build a College List- Xello
- Search for Scholarships- Xello/ Ms. Morgan's Emails/Monthly 2024 GLT Newsletter

#### Students must connect their Common Applications with Xello

BEFORE sending requests to their recommenders, students need to connect their Common Application to their Xello account!

This enables us as their counselors to submit all necessary documents and complete all required recommendations.

#### **GROSSMONT-CUYAMACA COLLEGE PROMISE**



#### What is the Grossmont-Cuyamaca College Promise?

The Promise is an opportunity for first-time students who are CA residents attending full-time to attend college tuition-free for up to 2 years. The Promise helps students become career and transfer ready, providing seamless guidance and financial support through the completion of their academic and career development goals.

#### What is covered under the Grossmont-Cuyamaca College Promise?

The Promise program covers tuition and mandatory student fees for fall and spring semesters.

- \* \$46 per Unit
- \* \$20 State-mandated Health Fee (Summer \$17)
- \* \$1 Student Representation Fee
- \* \$5 Student Center Construction Fee (Cuyamaca College)

#### What does the Grossmont-Cuyamaca College Promise NOT pay for?

Students are responsible for paying for books, supplies, parking permits, and any course fees. Additional financial support may be available through financial aid for eligible students.

#### Does the Grossmont-Cuyamaca College Promise cover summer classes (taken after high school)?

No. Tuition and mandatory fees for summer classes are not included in the Grossmont-Cuyamaca College Promise. Enrollment in summer classes does not impact eligibility for the Promise in fall, but costs are the responsibility of the student.
