
ENGLISH LEARNER FAMILY TOOLKIT www.ed.gov

The toolkit provides information, tips, and resources that EL families may need as they prepare to enroll their children in public schools across the United States. The chapters are designed to assist families with navigating the U.S. school system by providing helpful questions they might ask teachers and school staff.

Each topic covered in the *English Learner Family Toolkit* is divided into 5 parts: (1) *General Information, (2) Family and Student Rights. (3) Questions to Ask School Staff, (4) Tips, and (5) Resources.* All resources in the Toolkit are available online for free.
